
Dear Mr. Haycock:

As you are aware the water supply for this upcoming year is less than adequate. The forecasts are not very promising for the next several months. Therefore, under Article 31 of the October 18, 1934 contract between the United States Government and Utah Power & Light Company, the Association will exercise its right to store all power water in excess of 125 CFS.

The Association has been storing all power water over the winter and will continue to store the 125 cfs power water after March 1st until further notice.

The Association appreciates the excellent working relationship with your company.

1990-91 PINEVIEW OPERATIONS

AS OF OCTOBER 1, 1990, OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION HAD 11,748 ACRE FEET OF HOLDOVER STORED WATER THAT COULD BE CONSIDERED AS UNRELEASED BUT RELEASABLE STORED WATER HELD IN THE RESERVOIR AT THAT TIME AS DEFINED BY ARTICLE 31 OF THE OCTOBER 18, 1934 CONTRACT WITH THE BUREAU OF RECLAMATION.

WATER STORED DURING THE NOVEMBER AND DECEMBER 1990 CONSTRUCTION PERIOD ON THE OGDEN CANYON PIPELINE THAT COULD BE CONSIDERED STORED FOR THE CONVENIENCE OF THE POWER COMPANY TO BE RELEASED AT A LATER TIME AMOUNTED TO 5,646 ACRE FEET.

DURING THE COLDEST PART OF THE WINTER WHEN THE POWER COMPANY NORMALLY RUNS A MINIMUM OF FLOW THROUGH THE POWER PLANT FOR WHAT THEY CALL KEEPING THE PLANT WARM THE OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION VERBALLY REQUESTED THAT THE POWER COMPANY HOLD OFF RELEASING THIS MINIMUM FLOW BECAUSE OF THE SHORTFALL IN SNOWPACK.

OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION LETTER OF MARCH 3, 1991 STATES THAT THE ASSOCIATION INTENDS TO USE THE WATER STORED SINCE OCTOBER 1, 1990 AS PART OF THEIR 1991 STORAGE ALLOTMENT.

OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION LETTER OF MARCH 15, 1991 NOTIFIED THE POWER COMPANY THAT THEY WERE RELEASING 200 CFS PER DAY (PIPELINE CAPACITY) TO THE POWER COMPANY AND THAT WEBER BASIN INTENDED TO PICK UP THIS WATER AS PART OF THEIR 1991 STORAGE. THE OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION WAS ALSO FORGOING THEIR RIGHT TO STORE 125 CFS PER DAY INFLOW AND THAT WEBER BASIN WAS ALSO GOING TO STORE THAT WATER.

OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION LETTER OF APRIL 9, 1991 STOPPED THE RELEASE OF 200 CFS PER DAY OF RELEASABLE POWER WATER BACK TO THE POWER COMPANY.

OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION LETTER OF APRIL 23, 1991 NOTIFIED THE COMMISSIONER THAT THEY INTENDED TO STORE THE 125 CFS OF POWER WATER AVAILABLE UNDER THE AGREEMENT WITH THE POWER COMPANY.

THE ABOVE MENTIONED WATER WAS STORED ALONG WITH ALL OTHER SURPLUS NATURAL FLOW TO OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION CREDIT UNTIL THE MORNING OF MAY 12, 1991 WHEN THE CREDIT OF OGDEN RIVER WATER USERS' ASSOCIATION REACHED THE 44,175 ACRE FEET THEY ARE ENTITLED TO DURING ANY ONE SEASON.

THE CONTRACT DATED JANUARY 8, 1958 PARAGRAPH 11 STATES THAT WATER ENTERING THE RESERVOIR EACH YEAR FOR STORAGE SHALL BE FIRST CREDITED TO THE ASSOCIATION UNTIL THE ASSOCIATION'S CAPACITY OF 44,175 ACRE-FEET IS FILLED ONCE EACH YEAR AND ANY AMOUNTS IN EXCESS OF 44,175 ACRE-FEET SHALL BE CREDITED TO THE DISTRICT.
