Dear Stan:

Today I met with Boyd Clayton concerning the past due reports on the Provo River and our efforts to help you publish them. He reported that yesterday you gave him the spread sheet data (which is essentially the data for the Deer Creek Project) for 1985 and 1988 and that sometime ago you supplied this data for 1990 and 1991. I understand we still have not received the spreadsheet data for 1986 and the canal data for both the upper and lower Provo River for the years 1985, 86, 88, 90, and 91. As you know, we have been very concerned about these reports for some time. We are happy to now see some progress being made towards resolving the problem, however, there still remains a considerable amount of effort needed. Our offer to help remains unchanged and we have committed the necessary staff to enter the data into our Divert Database for these past years as you provide us with the information. You will be responsible to do the work necessary to publish the 1992 report.

We feel very strongly that all of these reports (including 1992) must be completed before the annual meeting of the distribution system on February 2nd. We can complete the data entry work and publish the reports for the past years if you will supply us with the data by January 15th.


We appreciate the extensive efforts you have made to ensure that the rights on the river are properly satisfied. You have an understanding of the water rights on the river and the operation of the river which can only be obtained by long experience. However, your record keeping and reporting efforts have not been acceptable. The experience with the annual reports since 1985 cannot be repeated in the future. The nature and complexity of the Provo River Distribution System is now such that adequate and timely reports are critically important. Future shortcomings in this area will outweigh the other strengths you bring to the river commissioner position.
