Re: Reductions in releases from Utah Lake

Dear Brad:

The following figures reflect the new maximum diversion rates for the 2002 irrigation season for the canal companies on the Utah Lake/Jordan River Distribution System. The diversion rates have been adjusted to account for change applications which have transferred a portion of the water right of the respective companies. You are hereby directed to adjust the diversion of each of the canals by the indicated amount for the 2002 irrigation season, or percentage, if the full amount is not available. The water represented by these reductions should be held in storage in Utah Lake until further directed; however, no year-to-year carryover storage will be allowed.

Draper and Sandy	9.6	16	50.4
North Jordan	54.0	66	27.6
Utah Lake Distributing	17.6	13	117.4
East Jordan	68.0	40	102.0
Utah & SL Canal	93.5	38	172.5
South Jordan	55.4	39	86.6

Also, of the diversions for the East Jordan Irrigation Company, Salt Lake City owns approximately 42 cfs, which will continue to be diverted into that canal.
