This matter came before the Court on the PETITION TO APPROVE 2009 COMMISSIONER'S REPORT, 2010 BUDGET AND SCHEDULE OF ASSESSMENTS, 2010 SCHEDULE OF DISTRIBUTION AND REQUEST TO APPOINT THE 2010 RIVER COMMISSIONER FOR THE UINTA AND WHITEROCKS RIVERS, filed by Craig Hansen, Chairman of the Committee for the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers, pursuant to Utah Code Ann. §73-5-1 et. seq., petitioning the Court to approve the committee's 2009 report, 2010 budget, appoint a River Commissioner for 2010, authorize it to appoint an interim River Commissioner and approve its 2010 Schedule of Distribution of Waters of Uinta and Whiterocks. The Court

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having considered the matter, notice having been given to affected parties, and the Court being fully informed in this matter, enters this order.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

1. That the 2009 report of the administration of the waters of the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers is approved, as submitted and filed herewith.

2. That the 2010 budget, with schedule of assessments, is approved, as submitted and attached hereto as "Exhibit A".

3. That Shane Hamblin is appointed to serve as River Commissioner of the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers, for a period of one (1) year.

4. That the Committee for the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers is authorized to appoint a temporary replacement should the River Commissioner be unable to complete the one (1) year term.

5. That the proposed 2010 Schedule of Distribution of Waters of the Uintah and Whiterocks Rivers is approved, as submitted and attached hereto as "Exhibit B".

6. That the following provisions set forth in the 1998 Interim Order be reaffirmed and made effective for the year 2010:

a. That the River Commissioner be directed to distribute the water of the streams and reservoirs involved in accordance with this Court's Interim Order and to do all things necessary for the

proper and correct measurement, diversion and distribution of said waters, in accordance with the Decrees of the Federal District Court and state laws.

b. That the River Commissioner is directed to confer with the committee in developing a schedule for distribution of water, specifically, the manner in which the waters of the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers, and their tributaries, should be distributed, after consultation with the State Engineer, and shall submit an annual Interim Distribution Order to this Court for its consideration.

c. That the River Commissioner is directed to deliver and distribute the waters of such non-Federal water rights in the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers, in accordance with the proposed Schedule of Distribution, attached hereto as "Exhibit B".

d. That the waters for the Federal and non-Federal water rights be distributed in accordance with the terms and limitations of the 1923 Federal Court Decrees in cases numbered 4437 and 4418.

e. That the River Commissioner is instructed to work with the committee to prepare a recommended budget for next year. Said recommended budget is to contain assessments to be made, monies to be received, along with a report of expenditures.

f. That the River Commissioner is authorized to manage the budget, to implement the ordered assessments and collection of

assessed amounts from the non-Federal water user organizations or water users, and request assessment and collection from the Bureau of Indian Affairs on the Uintah Indian Irrigation Project, in accordance with the approved budget and schedule of assessments.

g. That any person or entity, that is a water user in the subject rivers, or otherwise affected by the actions of the River Commissioner, may petition and appear before this Court (about the assessment amounts, the manner in which the water is distributed and/or any other claim relating to the distribution of water). In the event there is a violation of the Court's Order or any part of this Petition or, in the opinion of the River Commissioner, the occurrence of the unauthorized use of water, the River Commissioner is directed to recommend to this Court a solution to the problem, including any remedy to be imposed on the unauthorized water user or violator of the Order.

h. That if a non-Federal water user fails to pay any assessments levied, when due, that water users further use of water be prohibited.

i. The job description of the River Commissioner shall include duties and responsibilities as follows:

The Water Commissioner should to acquire knowledge of all water rights under his jurisdiction. These water rights will then be distributed to water companies in a

timely and fair manner. All water delivery will need to be recorded and presented as requested by water users and state entities with the inclusion of a final year end report.

The River Commissioner is responsible for all water changes and must be available on a daily basis. The River Commissioner will physically open head gates and make sure that measuring devices are accurate and that recording devices are working properly. He will periodically check recording devices as required throughout the season, or more often if necessary.

The River Commissioner will monitor rivers in his jurisdiction to determine when flows need to be changed. All canal companies' use, no matter where the water comes from, needs to be recorded and reported weekly.

The Commissioner will be responsible for payment of bills. All checks must be cosigned by a member of his River Committee. Any purchase over \$200.00 must be pre-approved by the River Committee.

A weekly report of water usage for each company should be mailed to the company or made available on the internet.


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The River Commissioner may find inappropriate water usage on the river. It is his responsibility to reduce this and, if possible, eliminate it. This may include resolving conflicts with individuals, getting help from the River Committee, involving the State Engineer's help or ultimately involving the State District Court. The methods used to resolve the problems should start easy and simple and pleasant as possible and go on to the next stage only as needed.

The year end report needs to be accurate and complete for all companies and ready for the River Committee budget meeting no later than December 1st.



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**COMMITTEE MEETING FOR THE
UINTA AND WHITEROCKS RIVERS
OF JANUARY 8, 2010, 7:30 P.M.
MINUTES**

Present: Shane Hamblin, River Commissioner for the Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers; committee of Dale Thomas, Uintah Indian Irrigation Project; Kim Bastian, Associated Water Users Association; and Craig Hansen, Whiterocks Irrigation Company. Also present, Vaughn Parrish Ouray Park Irrigation Company.

Minutes from the 2009 committee meeting

The minutes from the January 20, 2009 Uinta and Whiterocks Rivers committee meeting were reviewed and accepted as presented.

Budget Expended in 2009

The 2009 expended budget was reviewed the over expenditures and under expenditures of this budget were noted.

Automation

As the minutes from the 2009 committee meeting were read, the automation projects that had been planned were reviewed and the progress of completion on them noted as follows:

- (1) A head gate to be automated on the US Deepcreek Canal of the Uintah Indian Irrigation Project was not completed. Mr. Thomas noted what poor shape the headgate structure is in, but, there are no plans to redo it at this time. There are plans to redo the weir at the US Deepcreek Canal. The question was raised of why there had not been a gate automated going into the US Deepcreek Canal in the past. It was explained that it was decided it would be better to automate the slide gate going on down the river to control the smaller flows for those water rights down stream. When set to keep the US Deepcreek at a certain cfs the present system would work fairly well during higher water flows. A question was raised about the accessibility of the US Deepcreek headgate during highwater. Automation would help with access because there would be less need to drive into this heading.
- (2) Data collection and possibly an automated head gate on the exchange between the Whiterocks Irrigation Company and the US Deepcreek Canal was not completed either. This exchange benefits both entities because it gives water for Whiterocks Irrigation company to use above their Lapoint reservoir and Indian Irrigation gains water at the end of its US Deepcreek Canal. The Indian Irrigation Service had said last fall that they would try to get a stilling well and building installed for this exchange. Dex Winterton from the Duchesne County Water Conservancy District has been trained and, with the River Commissioner's help, could possibly get the monitoring system and data collection program installed without waiting for the Bureau of Reclamation to come out and do the work.
- (3) The automation of two head gates at the Uinta No. 1 Canal was completed. The automation itself worked well, but, the heading was redone and there was some trouble with loose rocks rolling into the headgates.

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(4) Looking into ways of collecting data from the high mountain storage reservoirs was not completed. Mr. Hansen said that when Whiterocks Irrigation Company had approached the Ute Tribe about repairing their drop that had washed out, the tribal Business Committee said they had a real concern of wanting information on what flows are coming out of all of Whiterocks Irrigation's high mountain reservoirs. They had made it clear they wanted some automation there and expressed the desire to have something more than just the reservoir levels, but, wanted to be able to call up to find out the flows out of the reservoirs also. We discussed the problems of no phone access at these remote sites, unless you could use a satellite. There are weirs on both Paradise and Chapeata reservoirs, but, without standing beside them, you don't know what flows are there. Whiterocks Irrigation had explained that the three small reservoirs drain down into Chapeata and would not need monitored the same. Because the tribe had been so adamant about this issue and had even said they were thinking about taking legal action, Mr. Hansen had contacted the River Commissioner, Shane Hamblin, about the urgency to get something done in this regard. Even if calling out is not possible, it would be beneficial to have some type of pressure reducer to record data of reservoir elevations that could then be downloaded later in spring when it is easier to access the reservoirs. Dry Gulch Irrigation had put that type of system on their Brown's Draw reservoir last fall that could be evaluated to see if it was applicable. Dry Gulch's high mountain reservoirs are in the primitive area and may be difficult to put any type of monitoring on unless they are covered under core allegations. It is also imperative we try to do something before they make more changes on Forest Service regulations for all of the reservoirs. Mr. Hansen proposed that we get with tribe and other interested parties this summer and go take a look and come to some kind of agreement of what we could use to satisfy all the parties.

Mountain Reservoir Stabilization

There was also some discussion about stabilizing the high mountain reservoirs, as it is being done on the Lake Fork and Yellowstone River drainages. The storage rights of those reservoirs had been moved downstream into the Sandwash Reservoir with its enlargement. There is no such lower storage on the Uinta and Whiterocks River drainages to move the higher storage down to. Mr. Bastian mentioned how the stabilization of the reservoirs on the Yellowstone River may make it difficult to do an exchange of water out of the Moonlake Reservoir on a dry year when water is brought clear over to supplement the Uinta River's irrigation systems. One possible solution that could benefit everyone would be to bring a pipeline from the Lake Fork River over to the Yellowstone River. However, such a project would need the approval of the Ute Indian Tribe because it would cross tribal ground and the Tribal Business Committee had rejected such a proposal once in the past.

Assessments

There was a review of how assessments are based on the percentage of the total water used in the system the previous year. On a good water year when everybody received water, the commissioner fee for the next year would be spread out over all of the irrigation companies. On poor water years, the Indian Irrigation Service with the primary water right pays a higher percentage of the fee and some companies that didn't receive any water would not be assessed a fee at all.

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Line Items

The 2009 salary and fica had been fully expended and as had been approved in the past the proposed 2010 salary included a 3% cost of living increase. Mr. Bastian stated that a raise be contingent upon the commissioners report being done on a timely manner.

The mileage was higher in 2009 in part because of the abnormal way the high water came with the rain storms, which resulted in the distribution of more water than average in some of the canals that only receive "high water." These were headings that are not automated and had to be driven to and physically opened to put water into them. These canals also required being checked more frequently. The mileage was budgeted the same for 2010.

The Workers Compensation Fund premium seems to fluctuate quite a bit from year to year. The premium was 1,775.25 in 2008 and so we had budgeted \$1800.00 for 2009 and then the premium went down to \$1,355.91 in 2009. Perhaps it depends on the number of claims filed? The budget for the 2010 Workers Compensation Fund was left at \$1,800.

The retirement would remain the same.

There had been \$875 budgeted in 2009 for legal fees, but the fees were higher due to the fact that additional counsel had been sought with the attorney Mr. Mckeachie regarding the makeup of the River Commissioner's committee and the improper use of river water. The legal fees were raised to \$1000 on the new budget.

The amount budgeted for the Associated water Users Secretary, Carolyn Winterton, would remain the same.

The cost of office expenses varies from year to year and \$1,100 had been budgeted for 2009, but the cost had only been \$951, so there was only \$1,000 budgeted for 2010. The office expense is shared by the Lakefork River Commissioner, Moonlake Water Users, and Dry Gulch Irrigation Company.

The phone expense was over expended in part because it was necessary to purchase a new phone after the old phone quit working. It had possibly have been damaged by static electricity while wearing neoprene waders. The bill had also gone up and so the amount budgeted for phone expense was raised from \$1,000 to \$1,100.

Evan though none of the money budgeted for computer accessories was used in 2009 we budgeted the same \$300.

The miscellaneous budget which is used to purchase canvas dams and waders, for example, was left the same.

The annual report had cost less to produce in 2009 because some of the binding materials and covers had been left from the previous year and so the budget for 2010 was left the same

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The mountain reservoir inspection budget had been raised to \$4,000 in the past to cover the costs associated with getting back to the reservoirs with snowmobile, horseback, plane, or helicopter. The snowtel reports thus far are looking well below average with Chapeta at 52% of average and Five Points Lake the highest with 75% of average for this time of year. There is however still plenty of time to receive the snowfall needed. The mountain reservoir inspection budget was left the same.

The budget for 2009 was under expended by \$676.51, which would be used to reduce the total amount of the 2010 budget.

The matching funds for the Water 2025 grants have been rolled over to the following years if not expended. There had been some this money from 2006 that was expended in 2009 by purchasing some batteries and some radios while they were on sale.

The Water 2025 grant money from 2008 was rolled on over to the 2010 water year. Some of this money could be used to purchase the water measurement equipment if necessary.

Water Measuring Equipment

The Utah Water Research Laboratory people had checked the various canal weirs on both the Uinta and Whiterocks River systems in 2009 and found most were giving inaccurate flow readings. The River Commissioner and his committee had met with the various irrigation companies and informed them that they should try to correct the problems with the recommendations from the Utah Water Research Laboratory. In order to verify that the corrective measures had worked, it was requested that the river commissioners purchase some water flow measurement equipment. It was decided by the river commissioners that it would be best to see if such equipment might be purchased under the Water 2025 grant that the Duchesne County Water Conservancy District is working with. We need to be up on how much water we have and how much is being used and how it is getting there, so we are not in danger of losing our water to other water projects in the west.

Water Conferences

Mr. Thomas made the suggestion that there be money budgeted for the river commissioner to attend water conferences. It was noted how at these conferences a person may not only learn from the presenters there, but, also from other people in attendance at the conferences.

2010 Budget Approval

Mr. Hansen made a motion that the 2010 budget be accepted and Mr. Bastian seconded the motion.

Committee Chairman

Mr. Craig Hansen was nominated to be the committee chairman for 2010.

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Indian Irrigation Service Duty

Mr Bastian brought up a complaint he had with the way the Indian Irrigation canals went off at different times in the fall. He said that water users on the Uinta Number One Canal, that he was a ditch rider for, said that they had received way more water on the Bench Canal, and yet to reach it's three acre feet, it ran with the Indian Irrigation water for two weeks longer. Mr. Hamblin pointed out that when the weirs were checked by Utah Water Research Laboratory, both the Uinta Number One Canal weir and the Bench Canal weir were off almost the same amount. Mr. Hamblin explained that during the high water flows the ditch rider for the Bench Canal had requested that his canal be set with a lower amount of water than the maximum flows allowed of 1 to 70 (1 cubic foot of water for every 70 acres), because, he said that they did not need the full amount. By using less water earlier in the year, it was necessary for the Bench Canal to run for a longer period of time at the end of the year to receive an equal amount. Mr. Thomas representing the Indian Irrigation Service said the it was justified for the Bench Canal to be run longer. It was suggested by Mr. Bastian that the River Commissioner put out a weekly or biweekly water report so that the water users would know where they stand. It was mentioned that it would be nice if this water report could be available on line. Mr. Hamblin said he would look into what it would take to make the report available.

It was also mentioned that in years past the Indian Irrigation Service put out a duty schedule. A duty schedule would be beneficial for the secondary water users, otherwise it can leave them guessing on how to manage their water. Mr. Bastian thought that one way or another, the duties of the different Indian Irrigation canals should be kept the same.
