Dear Mr. Olds:

On July 23, 2002, I sent a letter to Mr. Bob Fotheringham expressing concern about the misappropriation of water from the Blacksmith Fork River by Mr. David Keiser and Mr. Bruce Hall. On August 13, 2002, you sent a cease and desist letter to both Mr. Keiser and Mr. Hall. In response, I received a copy of the August 27, 2002, letter directed to yourself from Mr. Keiser. To date there apparently has been no response from Mr. Hall. In follow up conversations with Will Atkin of your North Logan office, he indicated a desire to set up a meeting between Mr. Hall, Mr. Keiser, and my Clients. By letter of October 15, 2002, to Mr. Atkin I indicated my Clients willingness to participate in such a meeting. However, to date no such meeting has been established. My Clients are anxious to see this matter resolved quickly and for the Division to use its authority to stop Mr. Hall and Mr. Keiser from the misappropriation of water from the Blacksmith Fork River. Please advise as to how you intend to resolve this situation. Thank you for your attention to this matter.
