Re: Water User Claim 71-932, Modena Railroad Facilities


Dear Ms. Haslam:

It has been brought to our attention that use is being made on the underground water well located near the S1/4 corner of Section 36, T34S, R19W SLBM that has not been authorized through the water laws of Utah. This particular well is limited to servicing steam locomotives under the present notation in the office of the State Engineer. That doesn't necessarily mean that changes cannot be made to the place and nature of use but it does reference a use that has not been authorized.

Our information indicates that a Mr. Waldo Harris has piped the water from this well to his private property and is using the water for purposes other than "servicing steam locomotives". Since the Union Pacific Railroad is still the owner of record and has the basic responsibility of regulating the water right we are referring the matter to you for your consideration and action.

If we can be of service in changing the usage through a proper application for permanent change then we invite you or your representative to contact our office where we may assist you. In the event you have questions that have surfaced through this notice we also invite you to contact our office in Cedar City for further assistance.
