Just a note to clue you in on the attached letter. This concern is based on a rumor that some "Treasure Seekers" are going to dewater the large, deep pond in Three Lake Canyon north of Kanab. They hope to locate Montezuma's Treasure at the bottom of the lake or within an excavated tunnel near the bottom. I have no further detail but have advised those concerned parties who keep calling in to file a protest of record.

The only water right on the pond is for stockwatering so there will not be a direct impact if the landowner is agreeable to the dewatering project.

Dear Mr. Clarkson and Mr. Child,

Three Lakes is an important hydro-geologic feature in providing recharge to the springs in Kanab Canyon, and also to the Kanab City wells downgrade of Three Lakes. Interruption of this system by the draining of the largest of Three Lakes, as you intend, could have a severe impact upon existing water rights in Kanab Canyon, as well as upon Kanab City wells.


On the recommendation of the State Engineer's office, this letter is to notify you that in the event of an adverse effect upon our water rights due to the draining of Three Lakes, we would be entitled to, and would seek, appropriate compensation as per state law.


