

## FINANCING THE CAMP

The purchase price of the property, all the money being spent for improvements, insurance, utilities and salaries, is being divided equally between the Methodist and United Church district organizations. Each denomination has invested \$20,000 in the project to buy and maintain the camp for the first 10 months, until grounds fees begin to yield some income in June, 1964.

## HERE IS WHERE YOU COME IN

Both denominations have borrowed money in order to purchase the Pine Cliff Conference Center, since the owner demanded cash. Therefore, the Methodists and United Church group are holding simultaneous financial campaigns to pay off the debts that have been accrued. There are some 5,000 Methodist Church members in Utah, and 2,000 United Church members (Congregationalists). There is certainly enough financial strength among this many Protestants to handle our investment easily, if everyone will do his part. We have purchased the camp on faith, but "faith without works is dead."


## VISIT PINE CLIFF CAMP NOW

## THE NEED FOR A PROTESTANT CAMP

For the past 10 years, some of the major Protestant groups have been looking for a suitable location for summer youth camps, adult planning conferences, and local church retreats. Special committees of laymen and Ministers have consulted with the National Forest Rangers in the area of the Wasatch and Uintah mountains, within a radius of 100 miles of the major cities of the Wasatch Front. The growth of Protestant Churches in the metropolitan area of Salt Lake City, from Ogden to Provo, has increased the demand for such a site. No suitable location at a reasonable price was found until June, 1963 when Pine Cliff Inn, an old resort about 60 miles northeast of Salt Lake City, came on the market.

## HOW THE PROJECT GOT STARTED

Two denominational executives visited Pine Cliff Inn as soon as it was offered for sale, and being impressed with the beauty of the location, its accessibility, and potential for development as a camp-site, they took out an option at once. Letters were sent out to ministers and church members, asking them to visit Pine Cliff Inn and to appraise the property for a Conference grounds. After receiving many enthusiastic endorsements of the project, a corporation was set up, with equal representation of both denominations on the Board of Directors, and the resort was purchased for \$35,500.

## UTAH PROTESTANT CAMPS FOUNDATION

This is the name of the Corporation which owns the Pine Cliff Church Conference Center. There are 6 Directors on the Board for the Methodist Churches of Utah, and 6 from the Utah Association of the United Church of Christ. The Articles and By-Laws are so worded as to permit other Protestant denominations to join, and also to permit the eventual purchase of other camp-sites as the need arises.

## BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE CAMP

The 40 acre grounds include a large meadow, two streams, blue spruce, Douglas fir, juniper and cottonwood trees. A tawney rock cliff rises to the northeast, making a striking back-drop to the camp. Buildings include a social hall, 9 cabins, garage with second story apartment, and a custodian's house. Water is pumped from a well. The property has electric power, and gas from the Mountain Fuel Supply Co. The highway is paved to within 3 miles of the camp. There is plenty of space for camping on the grounds, and hiking can be enjoyed in the nearby forest area. The cabins are equipped with double-deck bunks, and small wood-burning stoves. Accommodations for 75 people will be available in the summer of 1964. A caretaker is being employed to watch the property throughout the year.
