

PROVO RIVER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM WATER USERS
January 25, 2011

Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Devey.

Adoption of Minutes

Mr. VanWagoner made a motion to approve the minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Jones. The motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner's Report

Mr. Roberts presented Mr. Sim with a copy of the annual report. A copy of "Summary 2010" was distributed. A copy of the summary is attached and is made a part of these minutes by this reference. Mr. Roberts then reviewed the summary in detail. Mr. Roberts expressed his appreciation to everyone for their cooperation in making this system work.

Mr. Knight made a motion to accept the Commissioner's Report. Mr. VanWagoner seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Review of Concerns Related to Commissioner's Work for 2010

Mr. Devey stated that from Central Utah Water Conservancy District's standpoint, Mr. Roberts has done a great job this past year. Numbers have been available when needed and the power numbers are closer to being updated. Mr. Roberts has been a joy to work with the past year. Mr. Bryant said he will second that from Jordan Valley Water Conservancy District. Mr. Roberts has done a great job this last year. Mr. Budge stated that Provo River Water Users Association has also had a good response time when numbers were needed. Mr. Devey again commended him on doing a good job and encouraged Mr. Roberts to continue in the same manner.

Report from the Division of Water Rights

Mr. Sim stated that he is discussing the Division's budget in each distribution system meeting. Currently the indications are that the Division of Water Rights will have a budget cut of 7%, which equates to six engineering positions. There are currently 32 engineering positions within the department throughout the State and if six are cut it will be impossible to continue doing the work they are currently doing. So he expressed that if anybody feels so inclined to please contact your legislatures and give a kind word about the Division of Water Rights and the work they do.

Ms. Odekirk expressed appreciation to Mr. Devey and to Stan Roberts for the time he spent with her to explain how he distributes water on the river system in detail. She said she is currently working on a manual that will provide the benefit of Mr. Roberts experience and knowledge. She also stated that her intention this upcoming season is to spend time on the Provo River looking at the measurement devices, to check the accuracy of the meters, and to create rating tables or whatever is needed to make the meters more accurate.

Hearing the 2010 Financial Reports

Copies of the "Provo River Distribution System Trust Fund 2010 Financial Statement" and the "Provo River (LCD) Distribution System Trust Fund 2010 Financial Statement" were distributed. Ms. Odekirk discussed the "Provo River Distribution System Trust Fund 2010 Financial Statement" and the "Provo River (LCD) Distribution System Fund 2010 Financial Statement" in

detail. Copies of these statements are attached and made a part of these minutes by this reference.

Mr. Jones made a motion to accept the financial reports. The motion was seconded by Mr. Simons. The motion passed unanimously.

Reviewing Delinquent Assessment Accounts

Ms. Odekirk discussed the delinquent accounts stating the bulk of accounts are delinquent most likely due to the State not having the current information on the water user and so the bill does not get paid. Mr. Sim pointed out on a positive note that the delinquencies are down this year.

Ms. Odekirk stated that where there is an individual home or a domestic use account in a subdivision and the state loses tracks of the water users, they would like to inactivate the assessment account. Mr. Sim stated this is what the state is going to do because it is an issue on other systems as well. Each year they will bring to the board a list of accounts and if there is not a really good reason then the accounts will be made inactive. By making them inactive no more assessments will be added and no additional delinquent penalties will be added. If the owner is found they can be reactivated.

Ms. Odekirk also asked the Board if they would be willing to waive delinquent penalties where the user did come into the State office and they somehow didn't get put into the billing system and did not pay was because they did not receive an assessment from the state. Mr. VanWagoner stated that this subject had come up in the earlier meeting and it was decided that the new owner should not have to pay delinquent penalties for assessments they did not receive. Mr. Sim stated the penalties would be removed from those accounts.

Discussion of the 2010 Budget

The line item budget for the Provo River Distribution System, as discussed in the morning meeting of the Board on January 25, 2010, was presented to Mr. Sim. A one and one-half percent (1.5%) increase was approved for Mr. Roberts making his salary \$68,419. Social Security was set at \$5,200, Retirement at \$12,000, and Insurance at \$12,000. Travel Expense was set at \$2,300. The salary for Mr. Brown was set at \$10,983 again reflecting a one and one-half percent (1.5%) increase. Social Security was increased to \$900 and the Insurance was left the same at \$150. Travel Expense for Mr. Brown was increased to \$1,700. Secretary Expense was set at \$1,000, Committee Expense \$3,000, Office Expense \$1,800, Supplies and Equipment \$2,000, Telephone Expense \$1,600, Miscellaneous Expense \$848, State Engineer Assessment \$8,800, and Annual Report \$1,300. There was nothing budgeted for System Transfer. The budget totals \$136,000.

The budget for the Provo River (LCD) was then discussed. Mr. Roberts salary was increased to \$1,568 reflecting the one and one-half percent (1.5%) increase. Social Security was set at \$120,

Retirement at \$250, and Insurance at \$25. The State Engineer Assessment was set at \$145. The total budget is \$2,108.

Mr. VanWagoner made a motion to accept both budgets. Mr. Budge seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Setting the Distribution System Assessments

Mr. Devey stated that in the earlier meeting the Board voted to set the assessments the same as last year. Mr. VanWagoner made a motion to set the assessment for \$136,000 for the Provo River Distribution System and \$3,000 for the Provo River (LCD) Distribution System. The motion was seconded by Mr. Brown. The motion passed unanimously.

Selection of a New Distribution System Chairman and Committee Members

Mr. Devey stated that in the previous meeting the Board passed a motion to make Mr. Devey the Chairman of the Committee and Mr. VanWagoner, Vice-Chairman. Mr. Devey also introduced Mr. Earl McNeil as the new Board member to replace Mr. Ed Ure representing the Kamas Valley Canals.

Other Business

Mr. Devey turned the floor to Mr. Sim to make a presentation on accessing the new Water Company page on the Water Right web page. Mr. Sim stated that Ms. Wilhelmsen would be doing the presentation and asked for the meeting to be adjourned.

Mr. Budge made a motion to adjourn the meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. VanWagoner. The motion passed unanimously.

A copy of the handout distributed by Ms. Wilhelmsen is attached and is made a part of these minutes by this reference.

After serving for more than thirty-five years as president of the Provo River Distribution System, Ed Ure passed away in 2010. He had served many additional years as a board member representing the Kamas area water users.

A contract was let to enclose the Provo Reservoir Canal from near the mouth of Provo Canyon to the point of the mountain. It will take several years to complete, however, the canal will continue to operate during the irrigation season with minimal disturbance.

Litigation in court between CUWCD and Timpanogos, Upper East Union and East River Bottom irrigation companies has been put on hold as discussion on a possible solution to their differences has been reinstated.

As indicated by the following data, the water supply for the 2010 water year was much above average.

There is presently at Trial Lake snow equivalent to 23.5 inches of water. That represents 162% of normal. Last Friday the 21st of January we increased the release of water from Deer Creek reservoir in order to operate the Olmsted Power Plant at full capacity. This will draw down the reservoir only momentarily as we plan to increase the release at Jordanelle by 150 cfs on the 1st of February. If we have just a normal season here on out we will have to bypass a considerable amount of water to Utah Lake. Deer Creek is presently at elevation 5410.98 only 6 feet from being full. That represents 15,500 Acre Feet. Provo River Water Users stopped storing water Echo Reservoir under the power contract December 31. As of that date they had 10753 Acre Feet yet to bring over.

Jordanelle Reservoir as of yesterday was at elevation 6141.37 leaving a space of 70,000 to fill with approximately 24000 of that already in Deer Creek.

There is presently 14 cfs coming thru the Duchesne Tunnel and about 6 cfs thru the Weber Provo Canal

The Utah Division of Water Rights maintains a documentary file for each water right in the State of Utah. A water right file typically contains applications, correspondence, and other documents which pertain to the right. These paper documents are electronically scanned and can be accessed through this query page.

The Division also maintains a computerized database of limited pertinent information for each water right. Various search and listing routines are available to access the database information quickly and easily. Discrepancies between the information in the computerized database and that in the documentary file will generally be resolved in favor of the documentary file.
