Petitioner and the Committee for the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek, submit herewith the 2011 Annual Report of the Commissioner, the proposed 2012 Budget and Schedule of Assessments, and the 2012 proposed Schedule of Distribution, in accordance with the Interim Distribution Order signed by the Court on May 18, 1998. Petitioners, also, request the Appointment of the River Commissioner for the year 2012.

In support of this Petition, Petitioners represent to the

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Court that;

1. By its Interim Order dated May 18, 1998, a committee of water users for the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek was organized under the direction of this Court. Dale Thomas, was Chairman of the committee appointed by this Court to support the River Commissioner and to aid in carrying out the orders of this Court, in connection with the distribution system for the waters of the Lake Fork River, and the Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek systems.

2. The Committee of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek met on January 12, 2012 and Petitioner Dale Thomas was elected Chairman of that committee and is authorized to file this Petition on behalf of said committee.

3. The committee received and approved the 2011 report of the administration of the waters of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek by Leland L. Carter, the River Commissioner for the year 2012. A copy of that report is filed herewith.

4. The committee reviewed and approved a budget, with schedule of assessments, for the expenses of the River Commissioner for the year 2012. The Budget and Schedule of Assessments are

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attached hereto as "Exhibit A".

5. The committee has reviewed and approved, after consultation with the Utah State Engineer, a proposed Schedule of Distribution of the Waters of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek and recommends it to the Court, for the year 2012. The proposed Schedule of Distribution is attached hereto as "Exhibit B".

6. The committee voted to recommend to the Court the appointment of Leland L. Carter as River Commissioner of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek, for a term of one (1) year. Petitioner further alleges that Leland L. Carter is a competent and qualified person to act as said Water Commissioner.

7. It is requested by the committee, if for any reason the River Commissioner does not complete his term of office or is unable to fulfill his obligations as River Commissioner, that the committee be authorized to select a temporary replacement River Commissioner.

8. The committee requests that the Interim Order entered for the irrigation year of 1998 be reaffirmed and made applicable for the 2012 irrigation year, in the following respects:

a. It is requested that the River Commissioner be

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allowed to distribute the water of the streams and reservoirs involved in accordance with this Court's Interim Order and to do all things necessary for the proper and correct measurement, diversion and distribution of said waters, in accordance with the Decrees of the Federal District Court and state laws.

b. That the River Commissioner be directed to confer with the respective committees in developing a schedule for distribution of water, specifically, the manner in which the waters of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek, and their tributaries, should be distributed, after consultation with the State Engineer, and shall submit annually a recommended Interim Distribution Order to this Court for its consideration.

c. That the River Commissioner be directed to deliver and distribute the waters of such non-Federal water rights in the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek, in accordance with the proposed Schedule of Distribution, attached hereto as "Exhibit B".

d. That the waters for the Federal and non-Federal

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water rights be distributed in accordance with the terms and limitations of the 1923 Federal Court Decrees in cases numbered 4437 and 4418.

e. That the River Commissioner be required to work with the respective committees to prepare a recommended budget to be submitted to the Court along with a recommended annual budget. Said annual report and recommended budget are to contain assessments made, monies received, along with a report of expenditures. The Court, after receiving the proposed annual budget, shall provide a thirty (30) day period for objections to be filed.

f. Upon approval by the Court, the River Commissioner be authorized to manage the budget, to implement the ordered assessments and collection of assessed amounts from the non-Federal water user organizations or water users, and request assessment and collection from the Bureau of Indian Affairs on the Uintah Indian Irrigation Project, in accordance with the approved budget and schedule of assessment.

g. Any person or entity, which is a water user in

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the subject rivers, or otherwise affected by the actions of the River Commissioner, may petition and appear before this Court (about the assessment amounts, the manner in which the water is distributed and/or any other claim relating to the distribution of water). In the event there is a violation of the Court's Order or any part of this Petition or, in the opinion of the River Commissioner, the occurrence of the unauthorized use of water, the River Commissioner be directed to recommend to this Court a solution to the problem, including any remedy to be imposed on the unauthorized water user or violator of the Order.

h. If a non-Federal water user fails to pay any assessments levied, when due, that water users further use of water is prohibited.

i. The committee is recommending to the Court that the Water Commissioner have a more specific job description outlining his duties and responsibilities and have suggested the following:

The Water Commissioner needs to acquire knowledge of all water rights under his jurisdiction. These water

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rights will then be distributed to water companies in a timely and fair manner. All water delivery will need to be recorded and presented as requested by water users and state entities with the inclusion of a final year end report.

The River Commissioner is responsible for all water changes and must be available on a daily basis. The River Commissioner will physically open head gates and make sure that measuring devices are accurate and that recording devices are working properly. He will periodically check recording devices as required throughout the season, or more often if necessary.

The River Commissioner will monitor rivers in his jurisdiction to determine when flows need to be changed. All canal companies' use, no matter where the water comes from, needs to be recorded and reported weekly.

The Commissioner will be responsible for payment of bills. All checks must be cosigned by a member of his River Committee. Any purchase over \$200.00 must be pre-approved by the River Committee.

A weekly report of water usage for each company

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should be mailed to the company or made available on the internet.

The River Commissioner may find inappropriate water usage on the river. It is his responsibility to reduce this and, if possible, eliminate it. This may include resolving conflicts with individuals, getting help from the River Committee, involving the State Engineer's help or ultimately involving the State District Court. The methods used to resolve the problems should start easy and simple and pleasant as possible and go on to the next stage only as needed.

The year end report needs to be accurate and complete for all companies and ready for the River Committee budget meeting no later than December 1st.

9. The Commissioner has had problems at the Blood Draw Diversion and despite conversations with the water users from that diversion, has been unable to remedy the problem. New diversion works need to be installed which is the responsibility of the water users at that diversion. The Commissioner has estimated after talking with people who perform the kind of work that needs to be done that the cost of the new diversion works will be approximately

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\$4,500.00. The Committee requests the Court to authorize the Commissioner to hire the work necessary to construct the new diversion works and assess the water users the cost of that work, if the water users do not accomplish the necessary work within a reasonable time set by the commissioner.

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays as follows:

1. That the 2011 report of the administration of the waters of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek be approved, as submitted and filed herewith.
2. That the 2012 Budget and Schedule of Assessments, be approved, as submitted and attached hereto as "Exhibit A".
3. That the proposed 2012 Schedule of Distribution of Waters of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek be approved, as submitted and attached hereto as "Exhibit B".
4. That Leland L. Carter be appointed to serve as River Commissioner of the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek, for a period of one (1) year.
5. That the Committee for the Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River and Sand Wash Creek be authorized to appoint a temporary replacement should the River Commissioner be unable to complete the one (1) year term.

6. That the specific job description outlining the duties and responsibilities of the River Commissioner be approved.

7. That the Commissioner be authorized to deal with the Blood Draw diversion by arranging and paying for replacement or new diversion works and assess the water users of that diversion the cost if the water users do not make the improvements required by the Commissioner to the Commissioner's satisfaction.

8. That the applicable provisions of the 1998 Interim Order, as presented herein, be reaffirmed and made effective for the year 2012.

River Committee Meeting Minutes

Dale Thomas committee chairman calls the meeting to order. Those in attendance are Dale Thomas representing Bureau of Indian Affairs, Roger Ames and Lynn Burton representing Associate Waters Users, and Leland Carter as Commissioner for Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River, and Sand Wash Creek. Dale asks Leland to read the previous year's minutes. The Gentry ditch discussion from last year's minutes was revisited. The decision to have Leland Carter monitor the Gentry Ditch was decided against by Dry Gulch Irrigation Company. Roger Ames said "the ditch will have a \$500 dollar usage fee, and those who pay the fee in the Gentry group will be entitled to the water for that year. The ditch will be self monitored by the Gentry Group."

The discussion on Blood Draw was expanded from last years notes. A meeting last year was set up with Bob Leake State Engineer, Randy Hartman Blood Draw water rights owner, Roger Ames Associate Water Users, and Leland Carter Lake Fork River Commissioner. Bob explained the water rights of blood draw and explained that a head gate, measure device, and overflow had to be installed. Leland Carter told Randy that a Waterman 12 to 15 inch head gate with a steel heading and a 12 to 18 in ramp flume with an 18 in distilling well and a four foot linear overflow was what needing to be installed so the site could be regulated and monitored. Randy installed a slide head gate, and 8 inch pipe overflow and left the flume in that had no distilling well. The water washed around head gate and measure device so that no adjustment or monitoring could be done. This year the Blood Draw Water Rights have been turned over to Randy's son Brandon Hartman. The gate and measuring flume are none functional and there is no water going past to the Jerry and Glenna Huff who have as high a priority as Brandon Hartman, and Sandwash Irrigation Company and Dry Gulch Irrigation Company. Lynn Burton said that the Blood Draw Water Fillings have been a problem for over 20 years and that even though it is a small water right, the Hartman's should only be entitled to their share. Lynn Burton made the proposal that Brandon Hartman install or pay for the installation of a River Commissioner approved gate, flume, and overflow with diagrams. The gate will be a waterman screw gate 15 inches with a 4ft by 8 ft header. The flume will be a ramp flume of 18 in with an 18" distilling well that goes 6" below crest on ramp and is overall 3 ft high. The distilling well pipe will have a box made that will enclose 18" pipe and hold a bureau potentiometer measuring device. A four foot linear over flow needs to be installed. Once these structures are installed the Lake Fork River Commissioner will install automation to record and to control the flow of water. These structures will be done for only the take out on the west side. If Brandon Hartman wants to move water to the east side he will need to pipe it across the short span of the draw. If Brandon Hartman wants to do all construction and installation, the structures and installation have to be approved by the Lake Fork River Commissioner Leland Carter and installed before the dead line of April 15, 2012.

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The Lake Fork River, Yellowstone River, and Sandwash Creek Commissioner and River Committee will construct and install these structures if Brandon Hartman does not. During construction and installation the water right will not be serviced to Brandon Hartman and will continue to not service water until all costs are reimbursed to River Committee. Roger Ames seconded motion, Dale Thomas passes the motion.

The committee discussed if Dale Thomas wanted to sign onto River Committee checking, if so the whole river committee will have to go to bank.

End of minutes. Roger Ames made the motion to accept the minutes as read with correction to acre ft included, Lynn Burton second the motion, Dale Thomas passed the motion.

Dale Thomas wanted to discuss the training programs of the Bureau. Leland Carter explained one training program from Bureau of Reclamation in Provo has been about automation and web server maintenance. The one in Denver Leland Carter hadn't attendant but thought it was more on operation.

Roger Ames asked if the mileage budget was still high enough. Lee said yes. If the cost of gas hold at the higher end of three dollars a gallon though it will have to be increased.

Dale Thomas asked about minimum assessment. Leland said minimum assessment has been included in this year's budget with a minimum of \$50.00. After the \$50 was charge to each separately billed company then the remaining amount of the budget each company was billed was by the percent of water they used in the previous year.

Dale Thomas asked if Dex Winterton would be available to help in automation. The committee thought Dex would be of more help on the Lake Fork system but less on the other river systems. Dex would probably have to charge on outside systems during his own time and not as Moon Lake Manager. Lynn Burton suggested that when the Duchesne Water Conservancy District meets to attend and tell the board that we appreciate the automation that has been done in the past and would appreciate help in the future. Leland said "This may be a way to encourage the district to keep spending time and money on river automation, and may be a way to encourage the district to hire somebody that can help with automation on rivers and dams."

Dale Thomas asked that the Tribal water committee be notified when the court commission appoints the Lake Fork River Commissioner.

The river committee looked at and discussed the budget and assessments of 2012. The Duchesne County Water Conservancy District increased budget by \$2000 because we will now have to pay for the web service. The river commissioner got a new smart phone that would show the web on sites. The salary was discussed and asked how it related to this year's assessment of each company. Leland explained that the Farnsworth Canal Company, The BIA Us Lake Fork, and the Purdy had run higher than normal flows than other companies so their assessments would be proportional higher this year.

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Leland with the help of Roger also discussed how other canal companies benefited from a canal company above them running high water flows. Lake Fork Western and South Bonita had water flowing to them from Farnsworth that was not metered out of river. Also Class B, Class D, Class C had returns from high BIA USLF flows. Lynn Burton made the motion to pass budget and assessment, Roger Ames second the motion, Dale asked all those in favor, all said I, and Dale said motion passed.

Discussed the River Commission report. Lynn Burton made the motion to accept the report, Roger Ames second motion. Dale Thomas said motion passed. Discussed the financial reports, summary water diverted, total of water diverted, itemized report, category reports. Lynn Burton made the motion that all these documents be accepted, that Leland Carter be appointed as the Lake Fork and Yellowstone River and Sandwash Creek River Commissioner, and get report and budget to Gayle McKeachie. Roger Ames seconded the motion. Dale Thomas said motion passed.

Dale Thomas indicated that Fema had been helpful on high river flow damage. Roger Ames indicated Fema didn't help secondary companies.

Dex Winterton, the new Moon Lake Manager was invited into the meeting. Dex Winterton and Leland Carter wanted some guidelines on releasing water from Moon Lake, Sand wash, and divert water to Class D and Class C. The river board felt it would be appropriate for Dex to be the primary release of Sandwash and set diversions to Class D and Class C. Leland Carter would be secondary or backup to Dex Winterton on Sandwash. The river board felt it was appropriate for Leland or Dex to release water from Moon Lake, however they worked it out. Now if Moon Lake Board wanted Dex Winterton to Release all large flow changes to river then the river board agreed that would be fine.

Dale Thomas adjourned meeting.




Tailwater Section
