RE : BEAVER CR., - LONE TREE, WYO.

A committee consisting of Mr. Geo. W. Smith, Salt Lake City, Representing Lone Tree, Wyoming, Beaver creek and Upper Henry Fork; Mr. Timothy Potter, Linwood, Utah, representing Lower Henry Fork and Burnt Fork, Wyoming; Mr. Kent Smith, Linwood, Utah, representing Utah users, - all users at lower ranches on Henry Fork, called at the office today. Mr. Potter stated that various users were down some-time ago with a committee of water users interested in the adjudication of water rights on Henry Fork and tributaries. At that time it was hoped to get an FERA Project set up in Wyoming and Utah to gather information relative to land areas, priorities, etc. which could be used by the local committee in formulating a stipulation of water rights between all users of water from Henry Fork and tributaries.

Wyoming now has an approved FERA Project of some \$175 to begin this work and has been promised more if the project is to be carried on in cooperation with Utah. These men are now desirous of knowing what Utah can and will do relative to this matter.

OCT. 17: The committee above referred to, met with H.C. ^{Jessen}, FERA engineer, and explained to him what they had in mind. Mr. Jessen suggested a white collar project be set up, providing Wyoming set up a similar project. The water users would have to pay the insurance which the committee promised to do. After the project will have been set up, Mr. Heiner of Henry Fork Water Users Assn. is to be billed for the insurance money.
