RE : BEAVER CR. SUMMIT
(Near Lone Tree, Wyo.)

Mrs. Isaac A. Bullock of Lone Tree, Wyoming, called at the office and lodged a complaint against Commissioner Geo. Stoll and against his manner of distribution on Burnt Fork river in Utah. She was accompanied by her mother.

The Commissioner was accused in 1931 of visiting the Bullock ditch on Beaver creek, closing and nailing the headgates and tacking a notice threatening prosecution for any disturbance of said headgates. The water so diverted was turned down Beaver creek to the ranch of Calle Hickey and Frank Wadsworth for a distance of 8 miles, wasting and being turned out on a sage brush flat on the Boulger ranch.

Mrs. Bullock averred they had a priority of 1898 and first in time to that of said Hickey and Wadsworth. She further stated her husband went in search of Commissioner Stoll to lodge a complaint for the above referred to action and while he visited his house several times was never able to find him, rather indicating that the Commissioner purposely avoided Mr. Bullock.
