Dear Mr. Bullock:

We have your letter of June 4 relative to securing a water right for your land which is located in Wyoming by means of a ditch with headgate located in Utah.

I fear there is no way that the water right can be secured for Wyoming lands when the headgate of the ditch is in Utah because the Wyoming State Water Officials would have no way to administer the waters.

The proper thing for you to do is to apply for a water right in Utah to irrigate these lands in Wyoming. There is a ditch on Bear River at this time which is similarly situated, the headgate being in Utah and the lands in Wyoming. We would respectfully suggest that you write to the Honorable George M. Bacon, State Engineer of Utah, Salt Lake City, Utah, regarding your desires in this matter.
