Dear Sir:

As Chairmen of the lower Burntfork Water Users Association, I wish first to thank you for your prompt attention in the matter laid before your office in our petition of November, 1937. However, the situation grows more serious with the passing of each month bringing spring and high water time nearer.

If the Utah Engineer has done anything about it, we do not know of it as we have had no word nor sign of action from him. This seems to indicate "A do nothing" policy in that office.

We beg of you to put this matter in the hands of a higher authority if his office refuses to cooperate with you. The friction has become so intense in this district through the continued depredations of Mr. D. C. Jensen that most serious trouble is likely to break out in the summer if he is not controlled by someone.

Whatever action you can take to settle this matter, or present it to the Governor, if necessary, will be sincerely appreciated by every member of this district.

I would appreciate a copy of the water laws of the State of Wyoming if you have extra copies in your office.
