In regards to the letter I received from you stating Mr. Claude Sadlier had complained to you about me not giving him any water, I will say it is the first I had heard about him having any water, because he didnot ask me once for water last summer.

I was talking today with two different parties about him to day and they state he hasn't a water right, said his father helped put the ditch through but he want it for him self but was working for another party, besides the place was abandoned for over twenty years and was not irrigated or cultivated during that time.

You had better investigate this matter and if you find he has a right I will gladly turn him some water if there is any.

Mr. Jensen has been giving all the users a lot of trouble this spring cutting there ditches, so I guess he is looking for trouble.

What proceedure should I take to handle him?
