Dear Sir:

Mr. William McGinnis of Burnt Fork, Wyoming has just presented your letter written to Mr. Henry Heiner, also of Burnt Fork, for our consideration. This letter was dated December 10, and has to do with the proposed project for gathering information upon which the final adjudication of water rights might be made for people interested on both sides of the State line.

You state that the local E. R. A. Advisory Committee in your State has approved a State Project Number S-F2-133, setting up one Supervising Engineer, two Engineers, three Assistants, one Draftsman, and one Stenographer, with the provision that the State of Wyoming set up and approve a similar project.

We are very kindly disposed toward this project for the reason that we believe that the sooner a final provision or understanding of the rights to the water in these interstate streams is determined, the more quickly development will come for the storage of water for the benefit of all the users on these streams.

We would like to have you secure a copy of your State Project Number S-F2-133 for us so that we may pattern after it as soon as possible. All of our professional funds for this month have been allotted, but if we could get a copy of your project and make up a like project to send to Washington for approval in time to begin the survey on next month's allotment, it would save further delay.
