

LONG VALLEY WATER USERS MEETING
June 8, 1948.

A meeting of the water users of the East Fork of the Virgin River in "Long Valley" Kane County, Utah, was held in the home of Lawrence Esplin in Orderville, Utah, Tue. June 8, 1948, at 8:00 P.M. A notice of the time, place, and purpose of the said meeting had been sent to all of the water users in the area from the office of the State Engineer. David W. P. Stevens was appointed to be Chairman of the meeting and Birt Gardner was appointed to be secretary.

A roll call showed the following persons and companies represented

GLENDALE IRRIGATION CO. represented by Charles C. Anderson, Vice. Pres
ORDERVILLE IRRIGATION CO. represented by Lawrence Esplin, President.
MOUNT CARMEL IRRIGATION CO. represented by D. W. P. Stevens President.
These three Companies represent over 150 small water users.

DAVID L. FOOTE represented by his Son Warren Foote,
I. L. BOWERS, EST. represented by Maria Bowers, admin.
No other independent water users were present although all had had notice that such a meeting was to be held to appoint a Water Comm.

The Secretary presented an unpaid bill of \$35.80 due Clifton D. Anderson for his work as Water Commissioner in 1947. A motion was made by Lawrence Esplin to accept and pay this bill and to levy an assessment of 4¢ per share on the 1st class water rights represented at the meeting to pay the bill. Motion 2nd by Charles C. Anderson and passed by vote.

A motion was made by Lawrence Esplin to ask the State Engineer to appoint Birt Gardner, of Mt. Carmel, Utah, to be Water Commissioner in this Long Valley area for the year 1948. In making this motion Mr. Esplin stated that Mr. Gardner had acted as water Commissioner himself in 1931 and had helped several others get started on the job in the years since then, and he believed him to be as well qualified for the job as anyone available. The motion was 2nd by Charles C. Anderson and passed by vote.

A motion was made by Charles C. Anderson to allow pay to the Water commissioner at the rate of \$6.00 per day with one trip around to measure and regulate the water at the head of all of the diversion ditches to be counted as a day's work. Otherwise 80¢ per hour if working less than a full trip around. In addition 5¢ per mile for the necessary travel should be allowed. Further that the central committee composed of the presidents of the three companies mentioned above should continue as the collecting agency to raise money to pay the commissioner. by levying assessments on the shares of 1st class water. Motion 2nd by Warren Foote and passed by vote.

A Motion was made by Warren Foote to have the Water Commissioner appointed earlier in the season each year. Motion 2nd by Lawrence Esplin and passed by vote.

The business of the meeting being thus completed a motion to adjourn was made by Charles C. Anderson 2nd by Lawrence Esplin and passed by vote.

The Secretary presented an unpaid bill of \$38.80 due Clifton D. Anderson for his work as Water Commissioner in 1947. A motion was made by Lawrence Rabin to accept and pay this bill and to levy an assessment of 4¢ per share on the last class water rights represented at the meeting to pay the bill. Motion 2nd by Charles C. Anderson and passed by vote.

A motion was made by Lawrence Rabin to ask the State Engineer to appoint Birt Gardner, of Mt. Garret, Utah, to be Water Commissioner in this Long Valley area for the year 1948. In making this motion Mr. Rabin stated that Mr. Gardner had acted as water Commissioner himself in 1931 and had helped several others get started on the job in the years since then, and he believed him to be as well qualified for the job as anyone available. The motion was 2nd by Charles C. Anderson and passed by vote.

A motion was made by Charles C. Anderson to allow pay to the Water Commissioner at the rate of \$6.00 per day with one trip around to measure and regulate the water at the head of all of the diversion ditches to be counted as a day's work. Otherwise 80¢ per hour if working less than a full trip around. In addition 3¢ per mile for the necessary travel should be allowed, further that the central committee composed of the presidents of the three companies mentioned above should continue as the collecting agency to raise money to pay the water users by levying assessments on the shares of last class water. Motion 2nd by Warren Woods and passed by vote.

Appointed by Warren Woods to have the Water Commissioner appointed for the season each year. Motion 2nd by Lawrence Rabin and passed by vote.

The business of the meeting being thus completed a motion to adjourn was made by Charles C. Anderson 2nd by Lawrence Rabin and passed by vote.
