RE: Long Valley Creek DIST. - FIRST NOTICE

Upon request of the water users, the State Engineer through Commissioner W. S. Carpenter will make distribution of the waters of the Long Valley Creek river for the season of 1936, under authority granted him by Section 100-5-1, Session Laws of Utah, 1935, providing that:

" . . . The salary and expenses of such commissioner or commissioners shall be borne pro rata by the users of water from such river system or water source, upon a schedule to be fixed by the State Engineer, based on the established rights of each water user, and such pro rata share shall be paid by each water user to the State Engineer in advance on or before the 1st day of May each year, and upon failure so to do the State Engineer may forbid the use of water by any such delinquent while such default continues, and may bring an action in the district court for such unpaid expense and salary, or the district court having jurisdiction of his person may issue an order to show cause upon any delinquent user why a judgment for such sum should not be entered"

Your pro rata share of the cost of the 1936 distribution, figured by the State Engineer from a budget set up by you water users, and approved by your Adjudication Committee, is \$ 8.56

This sum must be deposited with the State Engineer on, or before at once so that it will be available for use in meeting the costs of distribution as they become due. Your particular attention is called to that section of the law which provides that the State Engineer has power to forbid the use of water to anyone who is delinquent while said default continues.

According to the records of this office, you are also delinquent in past assessments as follows:

It is expected that all these sums will be paid and it will not become necessary for the Commissioner to shut off the water to force payment.
