Dear Sir:

Acknowledging receipt of your letter of February 20, I desire to say that upon more careful scrutiny I find that by reason of press of business, I over-looked several matters in your letters of February 13, particularly the question which you asked relative to on which end of the ditch a water user is supposed to install a weir for controlling and measuring water according to the state law.

There is no state law regulating this matter except that such installation is to be made as directed by the State Engineer. This law is made general so as to be applicable to any case and so the Commissioner might direct the installing of such measuring devices to suit local conditions.

Referring further to your letter, I don't seem to find the correspondence of which you speak relating letters written to this office by Mr. Carpenter and J.L. Bowers. At any time you are in the city and would care to come to this office, I would be glad to turn the correspondence over to you so that you might make a thorough search for the letters referred to.
