Dear Sir:

Your letter dated July 27 and Post Marked Aug.11 1934 is at hand. I wish to make this statement to you.

The Orderville Irrigation Company owns two classes of water, one -4.42 second feet acquired prior to 1890 and assessed at \$5.00 per sec foot. One--1.64 second feet acquired between 1890 and 1900 and assessed at \$4.50 per foot.

The water has been low this season, and we have received about 60% of our 4.42 second feet, absolutely none of the other . Several streams above us are assessed \$4.50 per foot and have drawn 60% right along with us. In other words we are assessed \$5.00 per foot and drawing equal water with stock assessed at \$4.50 per foot, then in addition we are assessed with \$4.50 stock and receiving none of the water.

I hope you can see this the way I do ,or if I am wrong that you will be kind enough to explain the error to me. I have paid \$4.50 per foot on the 4.42 sec feet and have a receipt for the same. I also have enough money to settle the balance and will do so as soon as I am convinced that you understand the situation and will act accordingly.

Glendale Mt Carmel and Orderville are assessed \$5.00

Carpenters, Chamberlains, Carroll, Spencer, McDonald, Majors, Brooksby, are assessed \$4.50 and all are drawing their equal share of water.

Then Orderville is assessed \$4.50 in addition listed as high water right and getting no water on it.

Please let me hear from you about this question for I am just as interested in fairness for all concerned as you are.
