Dear Sir:

I have your letter of the 29 inst. in which you say you have collected from the Orderville Irrigation Company \$20 and from Annie McDonald \$12.50, making a total in all of \$32.50 for assessments on the Long Valley District which have been applied on your wages for 1934. You ask that the amount be charged to you, credited to the parties referred to and receipts mailed thereto.

The matter with the procedure of which you speak seems simple but in the first analysis the law makes it obligatory that the state engineer collect these assessments and repay the commissioner. The reason for this is obvious. Hereafter I am asking that you remit without delay any collections which you may make. By return mail I will be glad to give you the state engineer's check for the amount, provided of course it is due you in accordance with the budget. In this particular case I am sending you herewith the state engineer's check for the amounts paid which you are asked to endorse and return at once in the self-addressed envelope, whereupon receipts will be issued to the parties making payment of the \$32.50 as above referred to and as requested by you. Hereafter, please handle the matter in the way suggested.
