

ANNUAL MEETING DUCHESNE AND STRAWBERRY RIVER USERS
ASSOCIATION WITH STATE ENGINEER

Time: March 4, 1963 at 10:00 a.m.

Place: Duchesne County Courthouse, Duchesne, Utah

The meeting was called to order by Wayne Criddle, Utah State Engineer. He introduced the gentlemen who accompanied him; Donald C. Norseth, Distribution Engineer for the State of Utah; Robert F. Guy, Area Engineer; and Frank Reese, State Engineer's Comptroller from his office staff. Mr. Criddle informed the group assembled, that this meeting had been called for the purpose of:

1. Hearing the financial report for 1962.
2. Making recommendations to the State Engineer relative to the appointment of a water commissioner for the 1963 season.
3. Hearing the 1962 Commission report.
4. Preparing a budget of salaries and other necessary expense of the Duchesne and Strawberry river distribution system.
5. Transacting such other business as may properly come before the meeting.

At this time the State Engineer turned the time over to Frank Liddell, President of the Duchesne and Strawberry River Water Users Ass'n Incorporated, who conducted.

ANNUAL MINUTES READ AND APPROVED

Mr. Liddell asked for the minutes of the last years meeting and these were read by Secretary Leland Wright. Being no corrections on the minutes it was moved by Leo Haueter and seconded by John Munz to accept the minutes of 1962 as read. Motion carried.

ASSESSMENT AUTHORIZED

It was moved by Clark Roberts and seconded by Jack Nielson that the State Engineer's Office be authorized to assess the water users of the Duchesne and Strawberry Rivers \$7,500.00 for the year of 1963 and debit the bank balance \$1,500.00 to satisfy the \$9,000.00 budget demands. Motion carried.

President Liddell presented the problem of assessments to maintain the expense of the committee of the Duchesne and Strawberry Water Users Incorporated Executive Board. State Engineer, Criddle suggested that this be figured into the budget. It was questioned if the Indian Department could participate in this type of a program and it was pointed out by Glenn J. Miller and Ronald L. Beardall that they could not belong to any group, but could help in the expense of programs working in behalf of the water interests of the Duchesne and Strawberry river. The State Engineer counceled the group to work this into the budget for the coming year.

There being no other business, State Engineer Wayne D. Criddle expressed his gratitude to the basin people, and desires for a good year ahead.

The Meeting adjorned at 12:00 noon.

Mr. Reese stated that some of these delinquent accounts have been paid since Jan. 1, 1963. Engineer Criddle informed the group that the attorney general has started legal action to collect these delinquent accounts. It was pointed out that some accounts are more than three years old. Mr. Criddle assured that these accounts would be paid or the rights forfeited.

It was moved by Clarence Baum and seconded by Wanless Shields to accept the financial report as given by Mr. Reese. Motion carried.

WATER COMMISSIONER REPORT

Leo Brady, water Commissioner gave a brief report. He stated that in the year of 1962, 290,000 feet of water was diverted on the system, compared to the 189,000 feet diverted in 1961 due to drouth conditions of that year. Mr. Brady predicted the 1963 year to be on a comparative basis with 1961. He counceled the water users to check their measuring devices to assure themselves of getting their fair share of the water that is available.

WATER COMMISSIONER RECOMMENDED

President Frank Liddell, acting upon the authorization of the executive board, recommended to the State Engineer, Leo Brady for Water Commissioner for the 1963 season on the Duchesne and Strawberry rivers system. State Engineer, Wayne D. Criddle accepted this recommendation and reported that Mr. Brady has executed his duties well in the past and predicted this could be expected in the future.


