



### LEGAL ACTION FOR NON-PAYMENT

This assessment is made under authority of the Statutes of Utah (Section 73-5-1, Utah Code Annotated 1953) and based upon a budget set up by a majority of your water users for the salary and expenses of the water commissioner of your Distribution System.

Section 73-5-1, Utah Code Annotated 1953, is quoted in part as follows:

" . . . The salary and expenses of such commissioner or commissioners and all other expenses of distribution, including printing, postage, equipment, water users' expenses, and such other expenses as are deemed necessary by the state engineer, shall be borne pro rata by the users of water from such river system or water source, upon a schedule to be fixed by the state engineer, based on the established rights of each water user, and such pro rata share shall be paid by each water user to the state engineer in advance on or before the first day of May each year, and upon failure so to do the **state engineer may create a lien upon the water right affected by filing a notice of lien in the office of the county recorder in the county where the water is diverted**, may forbid the use of water by any such delinquent his successors or assigns, while such default continues, may bring an action in the district court for such unpaid expense and salary, and may foreclose such lien, or the district court having jurisdiction of his person may issue an order to show cause upon any delinquent user why a judgment for such sum should not be entered . . . "
