Dear Sir:

Your letter of the 27th with list of applications of the Dry Gulch Irrigation Company from Lake Fork River is received. You did not understand just what we wanted to know, judging from the list enclosed. It is our understanding that the original applications of the Dry Gulch Irrigation Company set forth a total delivery of water of 3 acre feet per acre of land to be irrigated. We have been informed that at the time of making proof that their applications were reduced or changed and that the applications now call for a direct stream delivery of 2 acre feet per acre of land irrigated and 1 acre foot of stored water for each acre of land that is being irrigated. Please let us know at once just how much direct river flow the filings as listed are entitled to receive in a season in acre feet.


We are now in some what of a controversy with the Basin Commissioner, Mr Colton regarding the above. We understand that the Dry Gulch Company have had, this season, about 2 acre feet of water from the river, or possibly a little more. What do you understand that they should be permitted to receive? Has their proof as submitted been approved? Have certificates for the same been issued? Has definite action been taken on reduction of their direct river flowsupply?

We will greatly appreciate receiving a very prompt reply to the above.
