RE: BOXELDER DIST.

I have had a detail oral report from my Principal Assistant with reference to his investigations last week at Brigham City and am inclined to concur in his conclusion that an adjudication of the rights of Boxelder Creek should be preceded, if convenient, by the organization and consolidation of all the water users. With this in mind I am taking the liberty of enclosing a suggested form of Articles of Incorporation. These are based on the Articles of Incorporation of the Horseshoe Irrigation Company which solved a similar problem at and in the neighborhood of Spring City in Sanpete County. I have made a few changes in order to conform more closely to your own conditions.

In addition I am enclosing two blank forms for signature by water users, one for those who have an individual right, and the other for those whose right is based on stock in a corporation. I think it would be well for you to discuss these Articles and the forms with your committee and if they appeal to you as being a step in advance it would be a good idea to have additional copies of the blank made and as a preliminary step see how many signatures could be obtained.

Any suggestions which you may let me have will be welcome.
