REL: BOULDER DISTRIBUTION

I am advised by Mr. W. A. Wilson, Secretary of the Boulder Irrigation & Water Development Company that a water users' meeting was held at Boulder on March 16, 1936 at which there were present a majority of the stockholders diverting water from Boulder creek, East, West and Center Deer creek and Frisky creek and that you were recommended by a majority of the said water users for an appointment as Water Commissioner.

In accordance, therefore, with said recommendation you will be regularly appointed as soon as there will have been provided for you a surety bond. This is required under the law before the State Engineer can actually make the appointment. However, you may begin your duties as Water Commissioner and you are hereby appointed for such work until you will have received the regular appointment above referred to.

I am enclosing herewith a pamphlet containing the laws relating to water and water rights in Utah. Your particular attention is called to Chapter 5 found on page 37 of said pamphlet which relates to the Water Commissioner's appointment, etc. from which, after reading, it will appear to you that you are to make the distribution on the creeks referred to in accordance with the rights involved and in the order of priorities thereof. Please bear in mind that this is imperative and the bond referred to is provided for that purpose.

I shall be glad to hear from you from time to time and as necessity requires. If you have any questions relating matters of distribution please be free to submit them. Sometime either I or one of my assistants will make a field inspection and go over your distribution system with you.

Within a few days you should receive the blank form provided for bond, which please sign and return without delay, following the receipt of which your regular commission will be issued.
