RE : BOULDER DIST.

Dear Sir:

We are in receipt of your letter of June 19 relative to an interpretation of the McCarty Decree on Boulder creek, Garfield County. In replying to this letter, it must be understood that we consider your question a legal one. Inasmuch as we are not legally trained our interpretation should not be considered as final.

Referring to said decree we find the following:

"In normal seasons there are 24 sec. ft. of water in Boulder Creek, and 16 sec. ft. of it is furnished by East Fork".

It would appear from this language the evidence before the courts brought the Judge to the conclusion that in normal seasons (not normal flow) there were 24 sec. ft. of water in Boulder creek which was the water divided in McCarty's Decree.

If you cannot come to an agreement among yourselves, you should apply to the court for an interpretation of said decree which should settle the issue.
