Would you please write a letter to each of the following stock owners of the Boulder canal asking them to cooperate with us and allow the engineer to put in the measuring device: John King, Alf. Whatcott, C. V. Baker, Wm. Peters, P. J. Leavitt, and Chas. Haycock. John King and Alf Whatcott are above us on the canal, so the water would have to go around their diverters. The other water owners are below us on the canal.

Would you also write E. H. Coombs to put in a measuring device for measuring his Boulder water? He is diverting his Boulder water to the Deer Creek system without measuring it. While Mr. Ullrich is here we would like him to check up on the Deer Creek system divider.
