RE: DISTRICT ENGINEERS.

Dear Sir:

A number of difficulties have arisen in the Uintah Basin on some of the smaller streams, and, in view of the expense incident to a trip into that section for the purpose of taking care of these difficulties, I have decided to appoint a District Engineer in the Uintah Basin who will be available to investigate and settle such difficulties when they may arise.

I would ask you to kindly advise me if you would care to do this work at the rate of eight dollars per day, plus necessary expenses incurred. In computing expenses, the state allows 9¢ per mile for travel in a Ford car which is supposed to cover all automobile expense. Expenses also include board and lodging and any other expenditure which may become necessary because of the nature of the work.

I would appreciate your reply in the matter at your earliest convenience as there are a number of difficulties which should be settled.
