SPECIAL MEETING - PRICE RIVER DISTRIBUTION SYSTEM

A special meeting was held in the office of the County Surveyor, Courthouse, Price, Utah on May 14, 1962 at 8:00 P.M.

The meeting was called to discuss the need for repairing and improving the automatic recording gage below the Scofield Reservoir. Mr. Waterman reported that he and Dave Rowley, accompanied by Mr. Norseth and Mr. Erickson from the State Engineer's Office and a representative from the USGS, went to the Scofield gage site. Inspection showed that the gage in its present condition could not be used to measure the water accurately.


Mr. Waterman also stated that the estimated cost of rebuilding the concrete weir and relocating the gage house was \$1200.00. The U.S. Geological Survey offered to pay 50% of the cost if the water users would pay 50%. The USGS with the cooperation of the State Engineer would design and supervise the work.

A motion was made by Dave Rowley that the water users stand one-half the cost of making the necessary changes and repairs on the Scofield gaging station, providing the USGS and ~~the State Engineer's Office~~ stand the other half. Motion seconded by Harold Wilson; carried.

Albert Thayn, member of the committee from Wellington Canal, was contacted by telephone and he concurred with the motion. Bill Marsing was also contacted for Carbon Canal and he was in favor of having the work done.

It was explained by John Bene, secretary, that the money would be taken from the Price River system fund, budgeted in the State Engineer's Office. Mr. Waterman stated that he would meet with the officers of the Price River Water Users Association and see if they will help defray part of the 50% the water users are asked to share.

Meeting was adjourned at 9:15 P.M.
