

PRICE RIVER ADJUDICATION COMMITTEE MEETING

February 9, 1955

Meeting called to order by L. C. Monson, deputy State Engineer, acting as Chairman in the absence of George W. Waterman who was excused on account of illness. Meeting was called to order at 2:30 p.m. Official call of meeting read by John Bene, Secretary. Minutes of the last regular meeting read by Secretary John Bene. Mr. Monson asked if there were any corrections, omissions, or deletions to be made in the last regular meeting minutes. There were no corrections, omissions, or deletions made. Motion made by William Marsing and seconded by June Bryner that the minutes be accepted as read. Motion carried.

The Financial Report was made and discussed and explained by Frank A. Reese, Chief Auditor from the State Engineer's Office. Motion was made by Joe Krzyzno that the Financial Report be accepted as read by Mr. Reese. Motion was seconded by John Krissman. Motion carried.

A brief summary of the River Commissioner's Report for 1954 was made by Mr. Harvey Thomas, Price River Water Commissioner. Mr. Thomas stated that at the end of the irrigation season, 1954, there was in the reservoir a carry-over of 7,000 acre feet of water.

Next order of business called to the attention of the members present was recommendations for the River Commissioner's appointment for the season 1955. Mr. Harvey Thomas's application was read by the Secretary. No other applications were submitted. A motion was made by William Marsing and seconded by Lyle Bryner that Harvey Thomas be recommended to the State Engineer for re-appointment as River Commissioner for the season 1955. This same motion included premises that Mr. Thomas would accept the River Commissioner's position at the same salary that he received the year before. The motion was carried. It was also stated that the salary would be pro-rated on a ten month basis as it had been in the past.

The next order of business to come before the meeting was to set up a proposed budget for the 1955 irrigation season. The items in the budget were discussed separately and it was moved by June Bryner and seconded by Irvin Gerber that the budget be adopted, item per item, as in 1954. The total budget was \$2200. A motion was made by Irvin Gerber that \$500 be added to the budget to cover costs of protecting the water rights on Price River by any and all means. The motion was seconded by June Bryner. Motion Carried. This raised the budget total for the year 1955 to \$2700 instead of \$2200. It was further ordered that the State Engineer levy assessments to cover this budget.

Under the heading of other business Mayor William Welch presented and read the attached resolution. The motion was made by J. D. Critchlow and seconded by Donald Giacometto that Mayor Welch's resolution be incorporated into the record and that a signed copy of the same be attached to the minutes and mailed to the office of the State Engineer. Motion carried unanimously.

Having gone through the regular order of business, a motion was made by Joe Prettyman that the meeting adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting ended at 4:20 p.m.
