NOTICE TO APPLICANT

The approval of this application is not a certificate of appropriation. It is merely your authority to begin construction work, which must be commenced within six months from the date of approval of this application and prosecuted diligently to completion. To secure a certificate of appropriation under this application proof of appropriation must be submitted within the time limit allowed by the State Engineer. The amount of water for which certificate will be issued will depend upon the amount of water actually put to a beneficial use at the time proof of appropriation is submitted, the same, however, not to exceed the amount of water specified in this application. Proof of appropriation must be made in accordance with Sections 55 and 56, Chapter 67, Session Laws of Utah, 1919. For further information write the State Engineer.

The affidavit relating to the citizenship of the applicant, at the bottom of page 2, must be filled in and sworn to before a notary public before the application will be received.

Application returned to applicant for correction must be corrected with red ink. Erasures must not be made, but any matter may be eliminated by running a red line through it. All additions must be made with red ink.

Application returned to applicant for correction must be resubmitted to the State Engineer's office within sixty days from the date noted in Paragraph 4, under State Engineer's endorsements, or the priority determined by the original receiving date will be lost.

Applications resubmitted after expiration of the sixty days allowed by law for correcting same will be treated as new applications in all respects. (See Section 45, Chapter 67, Session Laws of Utah, 1919).

No application will be received which contemplates the appropriation of water from an artificial canal or channel.

Seepage and percolating water, or water confined in sloughs and artificial drains is not subject to appropriation through the State Engineer's office.

It is permissible to appropriate water from more than one source of supply provided the water from the sources specified is taken to one place and used for one purpose. In this case the point of diversion from each source must be specified in accordance with note in Paragraph 9. Also the amount of water to be diverted from each source should be specified under "Explanatory" on page 2, if only approximately.

Place where and date when application was filed in must be specified in the blank space at the top of page 1.

The applicant's permanent address should be given in Paragraph 2, and the State Engineer should be notified promptly of any change in address; otherwise applicant may lose rights initiated by application by failing to receive notices sent from the State Engineer's office.

Applicant should sign the application at the bottom of page 2.

No application or other paper pertaining to an application will be marked received unless accompanied with the required filing fee.

Applicants will be informed by this office when cost of publishing notice of application is due, and must advance cost within sixty days after so notified.

Requests for extensions of time for completion of appropriation will not be considered unless submitted on or before the date when proof is due, accompanied with sufficient affidavit and required fee.
