According to the USDA gauge there was 244 CFS in Burntfork. It held up around there for awhile and then dropped to 140 CFS AND held there for some time. The Midway head gate is still not fixed so that it can be controlled. It is listed in Wyoming but it is through the fence in Utah. Maybe a little pressure from both sides could get it fixed.

The Baldy Springs ditch had water in it all winter and washed out this spring. They were late getting it fixed and then it would only hold half of a stream. The Interstate also did better than usual.
