DEEP CREEK ASSESSMENT

The annual assessment is based upon the prior year's water delivery wherein the total acre-foot usage is divided into the total budget to determine a rate per acre-foot which is then used to calculate the individual pro-rata assessments.

TERM OF COMMISSIONER

The commissioner's term of duty shall begin April 1st and extend for one year or until a successor is appointed.

DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS

Funds shall be expended by the State Engineer as set out in the budget by submission of voucher by the water commissioner. Retirement, income taxes, social security taxes, and all other taxes and insurance shall be dispensed as set by statute.

- A. Over-expenditure of any budget item shall be by submission of a voucher which has been signed by the chairman and approved by the Distribution Engineer of the Division of Water Rights.
- B. Special budget items will be paid on submission of a voucher signed by the chairman and approved by the Distribution Engineer of the Division of Water Rights.

REPORTS

The commissioner will submit four copies of his annual report to the Division of Water Rights by March 1st of each year. Other reports will be submitted as specified by the water users on a current basis.

Term of Commissioner


CALCULATION OF ASSESSMENT:

As per the attached Summary, the amount of 9,217.00 acre-feet was distributed during the year of 1973. Therefore, \$2,500.00 divided by 9,217.00 acre-feet equals \$ 0.2712380, cost of one pro-rata acre foot of water.

The amount of \$ 0.2712380 times the amount of acre-feet as listed as having been used during 1973 equals his or her individual water assesement.

9,217.00 times \$ 0.2712380 equals \$ 2,500.00
