The Division of Water Rights has informed this office that your 1984 assessment for the Deep Creek Distribution System is still delinquent in the amount of \$3233.10. I also understand that you have been informed of the delinquency on numerous occasions and the delinquency was specifically discussed in the annual distribution meeting held on February 20, 1985.


Since your assessment constitutes a significant portion of the total budget, your lack of payment has caused an extreme hardship on the distribution system and the Division has been unable to pay all of the bills.

This letter is to serve as official notice that if this assessment is not paid in full by May 10, 1985, the river commissioner will be instructed to forbid use of the water and we will proceed to take legal action to collect the assessment. I sincerely hope that will not be necessary.
