Dear Mr. Hansen,

In 1979 and 1980, Utah Power & Light Company filed petitions supporting a State appointed river commissioner on Huntington and Cottonwood Creeks in Emery County. A State commissioner has been appointed on Cottonwood Creek, however, Huntington Creek is still without a commissioner under State authority.

We have received notice that the Bureau of Reclamation has recently requested your office to appoint a river commissioner on Huntington Creek. This letter is to reaffirm Utah Power & Light's support for your appointment of a State appointed river commissioner to distribute and administer the water in Huntington Creek. Utah Power & Light Company will pay its prorata share of reasonable expenses incurred by such a commissioner as assessed by the State Engineer and/or water users.

Utah Power & Light will continue to cooperate with you in order to expedite this appointment, and will provide data or any other type of assistance possible.
