Dear Mr. Jensen:

We have been notified by water users on the Lower San Pitch River that you have constructed and are using a small reservoir which may interfere with other rights on the river system. In reviewing our filings, I can find no record of a right for a reservoir at the place indicated.

I'm sure you are aware that all storage and regulating reservoirs must have a water right and must be approved by the State Engineer before construction. If the storage is greater than twenty acre-feet of water, plans and specifications must be submitted to the State Engineer for review.

Will you please inform us of any existing rights which you may have to the use of this reservoir and the way that it is operated. We will then review the use to determine if further investigation is warranted. You should make written application to the State Engineer for the reservoir unless permission has been obtained previously.

Attached are Forms 69 and 69A which are used for applying for permission for a small reservoir. The information includes the statutory requirements of location, height, capacity, use and the nature of the right being used to operate the pond. I suggest that this be completed and returned to this division with any explanations you may wish to add as to the methods of filling and use.
