Answering your letter of April 23 I would say that as far as I know all of Mr. McBride's time and attention are required on the Sevier River System. I will state, however, as I have already done to the Halls', that any private arrangement which can be made with Mr. McBride is alright with me. I cannot, as State Engineer, demand any services from him outside of the Sevier River System.

I understand from the last part of your letter that the request for appointment of water commissioner will be withdrawn if Mr. McBride will look after the work. Please let me know just as soon as possible whether the arrangements have been made with Mr. McBride or whether it is desired that I go ahead and appoint Mr. Weber. My experience during the past three years makes me feel that the Halls' will not be satisfied with any of the few selections which are really available.
