RE: BOWL CREEK DIST.

I have your letter of April 10 with reference to a commissioner on Bowl Creek and would say that the law provides that when a majority of the water users on a stream cannot agree about a commissioner the State Engineer shall make determination for them.

I have been going over the records of this stream and I find that you have, at different times, suggested four different men as water commissioner. The records show that you recommended the appointment of Mr. Ostberg and that later on you advised the office that Mr. Ostberg did nothing towards the division of the water.

In order to get this matter cleared up you are advised that, providing he will accept the appointment as water commissioner for the coming season, Mr. F. J. Weber will be appointed, unless I am advised by return mail that you wish to withdraw your request for a commissioner.
