

On June 8th. a part of the side-wall in the Canyon, nine miles south and east of Cedar City, was blown off by the J.H. Mendenhall Contracting Company of Springville, under the direction of the U.S. Bureau of Public Roads. This blow-off caused a dam to be made across the Coal Creek and held back about 30 acre feet of water besides causing an additional loss thru seepage and evaporation.

The matter of releasing this water was taken up by the Water-Users Committee thru LeRoy Davis, Engineer in charge of construction for the Bureau, who assured them that efforts would be made to release the impounded water and what was not released he would urge the Bonding Company of the Contractor to pay for. Mr. Davis has caused about ten acre feet to be released. Yesterday I talked with him as to what action would be taken regarding the remaining body of water impounded and he informed me that he was expecting word from the Contractor, who by the way has moved off the job, as to what action he, the Contractor, intends to take. Mr. Davis assured me that he advise me as soon as word was received. I will keep you advised on the action taken.
