Dear Mr. Halterman:

REL: COAL CREEK DISTR.

While in Cedar City last Saturday night, you briefly discussed with me the method used by the Water Commissioner in determining the quantity of water available from Coal creek for your company - North Field Irrigation Company.

I did not have an opportunity to confer with Mr. Leigh while in Cedar City; however, immediately upon returning to the office I wrote him and asked that he advise how the water was divided and the quantity available at this time. He has replied quite in detail, and for your information I am enclosing a copy of this letter.

I note from Mr. Leigh's reply that you have already discussed the matter with him, that you accompanied him to your point of diversion where the water was measured, and are now satisfied with the division. His letter indicates he is prorating the water available at the heads of the various canals, which in my opinion is the proper method of procedure.
