Dear Sir: REL: COAL CREEK DISTRIBUTION

I am in receipt of your letter of July 7, answering mine of June 28, 1938, wherein you explain that the city officials and the field users of water from Coal creek are negotiating a settlement on their differences with reference to the water at the city. You state that the city is now diverting from Chatterley spring, and for the present, there is no need for action by this office or you as Water Commissioner.

I am pleased to learn that there is a possibility of these water users settling their differences. This is as it should be and in the long run, they will be much more satisfied over the results if they are able to stipulate their own differences.

As requested, in your letter, I am enclosing herewith a table which gives the discharge, in second-feet, over a Cipolletti or trapezoidal weir having a crest length of $19\frac{1}{2}$ inches, for quantities of water up to 2 second-feet.
