Dear Mr. Humpherys,-


Since receiving your letter of June 28th. relative to difficulties between Cedar City Officials and the Users of the waters of Coal Creek with particular reference to the Chatterley Spring and the one second foot decreed to Cedar City for stockwatering and domestic purposes, these matters are working out satisfactorily to date.

The request made on me by the field users to turn the Chatterley Spring out of the City water system and return its waters to Coal Creek for their use has been disposed of in the following manner,-first, the field users have agreed with me that they permitted the City to divert the water from this spring under an agreement. second, they claim the City has not lived up to their part of the agreement it is therefore up to the field users themselves to turn the waters from this spring back into the Creek.

The City Officials and the field users are still negotiating a settlement on the one second foot decreed to Cedar City for stockwatering and domestic purposes. I am informed by these parties that they are confident of reaching an agreeable settlement.

To assist in working out this settlement both parties have requested that I keep a record of the flow into the City reservoir. This flow comes in thru two pipe systems, one carrying the "disputed" second foot, the other the water from Chatterley Spring and Cluff Spring. A weir is used for each pipe system, both weirs are the same size, the crest is $19\frac{1}{2}$ inches, trapezoidal type. Could you have a table made up for this size of weir up to two second feet flow? Any expense involved will be paid by the water users.
