Gentlemen: Re: COAL CREEK DISTRIBUTION

It has come to the attention of the State Engineer that you do not have a measuring device at the head of your canal to enable the water commissioner to measure out to you the water to which you are entitled from Coal Creek.

You are therefore required in accordance with Section 100-5-4, Utah Code Annotated, 1943, to submit to the State Engineer plans and specifications both for a controlling head gate at the head of your canal which can be definitely set and locked, also plans and specifications for a Parshall measuring flume to be installed in the canal downstream from the head gate. It is required that the plans and specifications be submitted to the State Engineer and approved in order that in sufficient time you have installed in this canal these devices before the irrigation season of 1950. It is urged, however, that the installation be made before that time provided the work may proceed without inconvenience during the present irrigation season.
