A question has come to my attention regarding stockwatering rights in the Bulldog Ditch.


The decree states: "During times of drouth or extreme low water it is provided that all owners of Class 1, 2, and 3 rights" etc.

This is the only mention of stockwatering rights in the decree.

In a letter from Hubert c. Lambert to the water Commissioner under date of Nov. 26, 1957, he states in substance that the stockwatering rights of Primary companies should be satisfied first and the balance delivered to the Coal Creek Irrigation Co.

I can find nothing in writing contrary to the above two paragraphs and yet water has evidently been delivered to the Bulldog Ditch for the past two years . In view of this I am turning them a stream untill the visit from your office on Dec. 10th. I would appreciate it if your representatives would come determine wheather or not a right exists in this ditch.


