
Dear Mr. Bacon:

The method of division of the water in the East Jordan canal between the city and the East Jordan Irrigation Company, suggested by the State Engineer, established September 1 and set out in the Utah Lake Condition Report of September 15, was discussed with and approved by Mr. R. C. Towler of the City Engineer's Office. It was submitted by Towler to Mr. W. D. Beers, City Engineer, and has, I am informed, also his approval.

It appears that the city is desirous that the delivery to the East Jordan Canal shall be charged on this basis and will take the responsibility of operating the diversions from the canal accordingly.

Prior to September 1, whenever the quantity in the canal fell below the sum of the allotments, the Irrigation Company and the city were charged so that each shared equally the deficiency.
