Dear Sir:

RE: MILL DAM DIST.

This office has just been advised that the flow in Mill Dam stream has dropped to a point where there is only sufficient water to take care of the 1852 rights. A complaint has been made to me that you are diverting the supply which, under the decree, you receive as an 1852 right through the ditch which was allowed an 1872 right. You have no legal authority to do this without filing an application in this office for change of point of diversion and having the same approved.

Please let me know at once what the grounds, if any, are for this complaint and in case you are diverting at your 1872 point of diversion you are hereby notified to cease taking water at that point and comply with the terms of the court decree.
