Dear Sir:

We, the undersigned appropriators of water from the Sand Wash Creek in Duchesne County, Utah, hereby make application to you for the appointment of James I. Gurr as a commissioner to handle the distribution of the waters in this creek for the season of 1932.

Monday, May Second there was a meeting of the appropriators on this stream and at this meeting the Dry Gulch Irrigation Company was represented; the Sand Wash Irrigation Company was represented and Case and Cannon were represented. Case and Cannon refused to participate in a commissioner and their claim is that they are not appropriators from the Sand Wash Creek. The other appropriators on the Sand Wash were invited to attend this meeting but were not present. However, they will all be approached and given an opportunity to sign this application before it is mailed to your office.

Mr. Gurr has been interviewed and is willing to accept the appointment and agrees to work for \$3.50 per diem and he is not to receive any other compensation.

Mr. Gurr lives near this stream and the nature of the stream is such that he can not use a car but will be compelled to use a horse and will do so without requiring any additional pay.

It is a little difficult to determine just what the budget should be, but after considerable discussion, we have decided that it will possibly require two days per week for about nineteen weeks and for this reason we have placed the budget at \$133.00.
