Dear Mr. Parker:

RE: SAND WASH DIST.

Enclosed please find amended Complaint which has been sent to me by Mr. Ray E. Dillman. This Complaint deals with an action by the Sand Wash Irrigation Company against some of the water users and Mr. Dillman advises me that the Judge wishes the State of Utah made a party.

I am quite willing to accept service on behalf of the State of Utah and would appreciate your preparing the necessary papers acknowledging the acceptance of service, entering an appearance, and then disclaiming any interest in the action other than a desire to have a court order which shall definitely settle the interference of Cannon and Case who have caused much trouble in the Sand Wash distribution in the past. All of the users on Sand Wash hold their rights under filings in this office which control the respective priorities. I have had, for the last two years, a competent water commissioner on Sand Wash but he has had much difficulty owing to interference of Case and Cannon with his distribution.
