RE: SAND WASH DIST.

I have your letter of July 24 with reference to the Mitchell matter and beg to say that letters of the kind I received from Mr. Mitchell are referred as a matter of routine to the commissioner for his comments. Such reference does not in any way imply that I accept the complaints at their face value. I consider that the commissioners are entitled to a large discretion in cases of this kind and unless there is something badly out of the way it is my practice to back up the commissioner.

This will also acknowledge receipt of your letter of July 24 with reference to your compensation and I would say that I consider \$5.00 a day very reasonable for the service you are rendering and would ask you to figure your vouchers on that basis. As to the bond I simply meant that I believe your present bond on file is satisfactory for the present season. I am also enclosing, as you requested, some white vouchers.
